

Overview of continuing education for

Basic Forensic Evaluation: Principles and Practice

October 2-6 2017, Charlottesville VA : This five-day program provides foundational, evidence-based training in the principles and practice of forensic evaluation. Content includes clinical, legal, ethical, practical and other aspects of forensic evaluation with adults. The format combines lectures, clinical case material, and practice case examples for evaluation of adults. Day five incorporates a report writing exercise

Certificate of attendance

A general certificate of attendance will be provided at no charge. This may satisfy many participants' needs. There is no charge.



Award of accredited continuing education credits/hours

Some participants' needs may require award of accredited continuing education credits/hours and may require additional payment beyond the registration fee for the training. According to Regulations Governing the Practice of Social Work of the Virginia Board of Social Work at 18 VAC 140-20-10 et seq., Revised December 30, 2015 (Statutory Authority: §§ 54.1-2400 and Chapter 37 of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia) regarding continued competency requirements for renewal of an active license contact hours of continuing education may be obtained from a combination of board-approved activities, that may include "workshop, seminars, conferences, or course in the behavioral health field offered by federal, state or local social service agencies, public school systems or licensed health facilities and licensed hospitals" under 18VAC140-20-105.
